1 **HIDDEN MESSAGE TECHNOLOGY™**
Words "COPY" appear on copy when document is photocopied on most copiers.

2 **REVERSE Rx**

1 **TONER BOND™**
Tamper Resistant Paper Toner Fusion. The paper surface is treated to fuse with inks and laser to an effort to prevent the removal of computer printed information

2 **"GREY SECURITY background"**
Distinctive GREY background provides "ERASURE" Protection

1 **SECURE RUB™** Color Change Technology
Washington State Seal and Green Rx's briefly change from Green to Yellow when rubbed or warmed.

3 **SECURITY WARNING BOX**
Visible Security Warning acts as a deterrent to those considering making unauthorized copies. Visible warning box in four (4) positions describe security features found on the document.

1 **ANTI-COPY WATERMARK™**
To verify the document is an original, tip the page toward a light source.

1 **ANTI-COPY COIN RUB™** Activated Security Rub with coin on back of sheet to see security message and Validate Prescription.

1 **Micro Line Printing**
"Warning Box" Border contains Micro Printed Security Text

1 **24# Bond (60# Offset) Security Paper**

To be considered Tamper Resistant a prescription must contain at least one of the following three characteristics:

- 1** one or more industry-recognized features designed to prevent unauthorized copying of a completed or blank prescription form;
- 2** one or more industry-recognized features designed to prevent the erasure or modification of information written on the prescription by the prescriber;
- 3** one or more industry-recognized features designed to prevent the use of counterfeit prescription forms.

To be considered tamper resistant, a prescription pad must contain all of the foregoing three characteristics. Failure of a State to enforce the tamper-resistant pad requirement of section 7002(b) may result in the loss of Federal financial participation.
